The number of GSA Assembly Members that can be selected by a given department\* is outlined in the GSA Constitution, Article II, Section C, as follows:

C. The GSA members of each academic department, as defined by the UCSB Graduate Division, shall be entitled to select one GSA Assembly Member for every fifty (50) GSA members in that department, or fraction thereof, according to the most recent fall census prior to the first GSA Assembly meeting of the academic year.

The number of signatures required for a GSA Member to be considered selected as a GSA Assembly Member representing his or her department are outlined in the GSA Bylaws, Article III, Section B, as follows:

B. Each academic department, as defined by the UCSB Graduate Division, may select Assembly Members, up to the number allowed by the GSA Constitution (GSA Const. art. II §C), by the following procedure:

1. For a department with fifty (50) or more GSA members: each Assembly Member shall submit to the GSA Vice President - Communications and Records a document to select the Assembly Member that is signed by a minimum of twenty- six (26) GSA members enrolled in the department.

2. For a department with less than fifty (50) GSA members: the Assembly Member shall submit to the GSA Vice President - Communications and Records a document to select the Assembly Member that is signed by a majority of the GSA members enrolled in the department.

\*The department must offer graduate degrees or it cannot select GSA Assembly Members
